

And he isn't really shy, so we had him come up with the band on the last song at the November service.


He is a cutie pie and studied Hank Jr. IV while he was up there playing. We thought we'd get him used to being up front at an early age before he becomes self-conscious.





Introduction to Rev. David Bateman

The vestry is pleased to introduce Reverend David Bateman who will serve as Interim at St. Edward's during the search process for a permanent priest. Reverend Bateman is currently serving at St. Andrews Episcopal Church in York.

Rev. Bateman has 25 years experience in pastoral ministry. For the last nine years, he has served exclusively in Interim ministry with congregations going through major transitions, particularly those having had long term rectors. Among the parishes he has served are St. John's Episcopal in Carlisle; St. Paul's Bloomsburg; St. Luke's, Altoona; and Mt. Calvary, Camp Hill. Prior to his Interim ministry, he served in various parishes in Virginia, South Carolina, and Tennessee.

Bateman earned a B. A. degree in Political Science at Kenyon College in 1976 and completed his Master of Divinity at Nashotah House Seminary in Nashotah, WI in 1987.

Among Rev. Bateman's areas of interest and expertise are: understanding of transitional ministry, preaching, special background emphasis in adult formation and education, training and background in church vocal music, and creative problem solving. He is co-author and developer of "Come and Worship," a Sunday morning parish Liturgy of the Word for children that is now in use in congregations across the country.

Reverend Bateman and his wife, reside in Harrisburg. His first Sunday at St. Edward's will be January 6, 2019.




Hempfield Food Pantry

The quilt was awarded by the QUILTS OF VALOR FOUNDATION - a national organization founded in 2003 by a Blue Star Mother by the name of Catherine Roberts. Her son served in IRAQ, and while he was deployed, she got the idea of comforting veterans with quilts. Since then, over 200,000 quilts have been awarded in the United States Company, IRAC and

the United States, Germany, IRAC and Afghanistan. The mission is to honor the service members and veterans who have been touched by war with a Quilt of Valor.

This year's recipient is Paul Bender.

Paul Bender's Army service:

Drafted in 1966, retired in 1993 with a rank of First Sergeant

Unit was involved in Vietnam; the Cuban Crisis, service in Barbados, Panama and Germany

Awarded the Army Achievement medal twice

Received a letter of commendation from the Department of the Army for his efforts in the Cuban crisis

Served as a member of the US Rifle team

Awarded the 416th Civil Affairs Outstanding Service Award

Recognized as NCO of the year, twice.

The quilts are made by the Quilts of Valor team locally as a part of the Lancaster Red Rose Quilt Guild. Several of us are members of Saint Edwards congregation: Dina Cerase, Sharon Hubbard and myself. Our group (about 15 of us) meet monthly to work on quilts, sometimes as a group effort, and sometimes individually. We don't keep track of who made which quilt....only the names of the Veteran who has been awarded. We first brought a quilt to St. Edwards when we realized Kate Peterson had served WAC during World War 2. Steven Casey gave permission for us to award the quilt at church, and established a new tradition of yearly awarding anyone who has been nominated through the national Quilt of Valor Organization, and is a member of St Edwards, to receive their quilt during the service closest to Veteran's Day.
