Here in the Diocese of central Pennsylvania, we are so fortunate to have our very own school for ministry that offers outstanding choices for faith-filled and practical education for all members of Christ's Body. At SSFM, a wide variety of options seek to nurture and strengthen everyone on their journey towards a greater understanding of God and a deeper knowledge of how we can live into our baptismal call to "seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving our neighbor as ourselves." I would like to encourage everyone at St. Edward's, regardless of age or where you find yourself on your faith journey, to consider taking one of the wonderful classes or workshops being offered this spring or in the future- I am certain you will be blessed by both the excellence of the learning as well as the wonderful new friends you will make. Because the classes meet online through Zoom (easy to access and use), SSFM is available to learners outside of our diocese which is a blessing and a tremendous asset to quality and accessible faith formation.

Ministry." This will lead you to a clearly organized drop-down menu with lots of great information (including a picture of yours truly having a wonderful time giving a brief workshop on how easily tone chimes can be incorporated into liturgy with little or no preparation or previous experience.)

SSFM offers a series of ten-week courses that provides comprehensive knowledge in a variety of subjects, such as Introduction to the New Testament, History of the



Episcopal Church, the Message of Mission, and many more. These classes are available for credit or may be audited, which is an outstanding option that enables the learner to benefit from all of the knowledge but without the same assignment demands as taking the course for credit. The classes I have taken so far have greatly enriched my own prayer and worship life and given me new insight into many aspects of both our Biblical and liturgical tradition. The instructors bring to their classes a tremendous wealth of educational, theological and practical knowledge from their own backgrounds and ministries and it is a real privilege to both learn from them and call them friends.

SSFM also offers a series of five week modules called "parish life courses" on a variety of topics designed to deepen faith and live into our baptismal covenant such as Ways to Pray: Spiritual Practices for link on the Diocese's webpage. During the learning weekends, which take place at the beginning and end of each semester at the Saint Cyril Spiritual Center in Danville, we share in not only learning opportunities of all kinds together, but community of the truest kind, where all are immediately made to feel welcome and loved for themselves and their own unique journey. I was amazed and overjoyed at my first learning weekend how I was welcomed and drawn into the heart of the gathering and made to feel as if we'd known each other always. The close friends I have made thus far through SSFM have been a source of deep joy to not only myself but our family as well as we continue to deepen and share these relationships through gathering together when we can and praying steadily for each other. This is a priceless gift not readily available in our world and it is worth savoring.

The theme for the upcoming weekend on February 8-9 is Doing Theology: Naming, Claiming and Proclaiming God and it sounds tremendously exciting- I can't wait to learn from the speakers and share in the conversation.



Make this valentine for a family member or friend.




What you need:

- 5. Deliver the gift and invite the recipient to assemble the puzzle.





The process to find a new rector for St. Edward's is underway and is expected to take a year or more to complete. The committee to lead this discernment effort

has been identified, as noted below. We have met with our consultant from our Diocese, Father Dan Morrow, Canon for Congregational Life and Mission. Work is underway to design a survey form that ALL will be invited to complete. It will enable us to collect data and information that describe the parish and its members, their preferences and concerns, their interests and opinions. This will be used to construct an accurate parish profile with which to attract candidates to interview later this year.

We are aiming to get the survey prepared to distribute at the Annual Meeting on February 17th. From those results, the committee will proceed to have conversations with as many parishioners as possible in the late spring. We will be as clear as possible about what we are doing all during the year. We ask all of you to participate when asked and to communicate with us with any questions, comments or concerns.

This is a spiritual process, to be guided by prayer and the Holy Spirit. Please pray with us that we remain faithful, filled with joy and courage as we proceed on this journey together to select a new priest who will care for us and continue to equip us for our various ministries.


