THE STORY: MATTHEW 22:34-46

Today's lesson is found near the end of Matthew as conflict between

Jesus and the people

around him reaches its height. Those that oppose his ministry are still trying to get him to

trip up - to go against the religious or secular laws and Jesus will not fall into that trap. Today's question from them is no different. The Pharisees ask which commandment is the greatest and Jesus responds with Judaism's most fundamental passage known as the

Sherma: "you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind." (Deuteronomy 6:5) However he does not leave it at that. He adds that another scripture is "like it," "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Leviticus 19:18) "On these two commandments hand all the law and the prophets."
