Welcome to our **Pre-Lenten Silent Retreat at Mariawald Retreat Center**. What a wonderful way to prepare for your Lenten journey! Whether you have attended many silent retreats or if this is your first retreat, our hope is that this retreat will present you with a rare opportunity in our noisy world to spend some time in silence.

One or more of the following psalms may be used.
