A Reading from the First Book of Kings.

1 Kings 19:15-16,19-21

The LORD said to Elijah, "Go, return on your way to the wilderness of Damascus; when you arrive, you shall anoint Hazael as king over Aram. Also you shall anoint Jehu son of Nimshi as king over Israel; and you shall anoint Elisha son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah as prophet in your place."

So he set out from there, and found Elisha son of Shaphat, who was plowing. There were twelve yoke of oxen ahead of him, and he was with the twelfth. Elijah passed by him and threw his mantle over him. He left the oxen, ran after Elijah, and said, "Let me kiss my father and my mother, and then I will follow you." Then Elijah said to him, "Go back again; for what have I done to you?" He returned from following him, took the yoke of oxen, and slaughtered them; using the equipment from the oxen, he boiled their flesh, and gave it to the people, and they ate. A Reading from Paul's letter to the Galatians.

Galatians 5:1,13-25

For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.

For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another.

Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh. For what the flesh desires is opposed to the Spirit, and what the Spirit desires is opposed to the flesh; for these are opposed to each other, to prevent you from doing what you want. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not subject to the law. Now the works of the flesh are obvious: fornication, impurity, licentiousness, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. I am warning you, as I warned you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit.

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. 

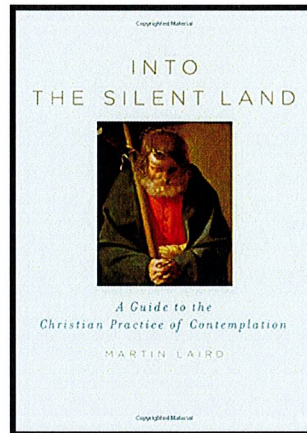

Keep the Blood Line Going: Donate a Pint

While COVID seems to be loosening its grip on society, the need for blood donations continues to exist.

With the changes in the economy and a worker shortage in all fields, local blood donation centers have had to greatly limit the amount of organized blood drives offered in our community.

For this reason, we have been unable to set up an on-site collection day at St. Edward's; however, we, the Faith in Action ministry, are offering a creative and rewarding way for you and family members as well as friends to donate blood.

We are inviting all to travel to a donor center of your choice, get a signature from a staff member to verify your donation, return the card to church; THEN, you will be eligible to win a very nice prize at the end of the campaign, based on a random drawing.

To be eligible for the drawing, you may donate blood any day/time between June 27 and August 7.

All you need to do:

- Pick up a St. Edward's "I donated" packet at church (*packets available starting June 26*)
- Select a donor center (list will be provided in packet)
- Visit the center during their open ours (you may be able to call ahead for an appointment)
- Take the St. Edward's "I donated" card with you to be signed by a staff member at the location
 - (*card is included in packet*)
- Return the signed card to church and deposit in the "I donated" box.
