- 19 I will give you thanks in the great congregation; ◆ I will praise you in the mighty throng.
- 20 Do not let my treacherous foes rejoice over me, ♦ or those who hate me without a cause mock me with their glances.
- 21 For they do not speak of peace, ♦ but invent deceitful schemes against those that are quiet in the land.
- 22 They opened wide their mouths and derided me, saying ♦ 'We have seen it with our very eyes.'


