EXECUTIVE LEADERSHIP

Our clergy, staff, and lay leaders foster collaborative ministry to advance the mission of St. Edward's, in forming Christians, and in in shaping our parish.

Vestry

The vestry are the agents and legal representatives of the Parish in all matters concerning corporate property and the relations of the parish to its clergy. Nine vestry members serve 3-year staggered terms. Vestry elections are held at our Annual Meetings in March. Each vestry member is a ministry liaison. Our vestry meets the third Sunday of each month. On the third Friday of each month, the vestry Senior and Junior Wardens meet with clergy and staff to discuss meeting agenda, proposals for vestry consideration, and reflection on our parish life.

Senior Warden

The Senior Warden is appointed by the rector from among the members of the vestry to serve a one-year term. As an officer of the vestry, the Senior Warden may serve consecutive terms.

Junior Warden

The Junior Warden shall be elected from among members of the vestry at the first meeting following an election.

Secretary to the Vestry

An Officer appointed by the vestry to record and distribute minutes from the meetings of the vestry.

Delegates to the Diocesan Convention

Delegates serve as parish representatives at the annual diocesan convention, typically held in October. Diocesan delegates are also required to attend the spring and fall convocation meetings prior to the annual convention.

FAITH-IN-ACTION

The guiding principle of St. Edward's **Faith-in-Action** activities is found in Matthew 25:37-40. 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? And when did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? And when did we see you sick or in prison and visit you?' And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.'

Our Faith-in-Action "responds to human need by loving service," serves to "transform unjust structures of society, to challenge violence of every kind and pursue peace and reconciliation," and "strives to safeguard the integrity of creation, and sustain and renew the life of the earth" as detailed in The Five Marks of Mission, an important statement that expresses the Anglican Communion's common commitment to, and understanding of, God's holistic and integral mission.

This ministry is committed to the following projects:

Hempfield Area Food Pantry – Each month, monetary and food donations are collected and distributed to our local food pantry that serves our Hempfield Community. Monthly needs are published in weekly communications.

Grocery Card Sales – Parishioners can purchase grocery cards to Stauffer Kissel Hill and Giant each month. Through this program, the parish receives 5% of each card purchase that supports our outreach programs. Cards are distributed the first Sunday of each month with payment due within that month.

Jesse Tree – Each year, we purchase gifts in support of local community groups that serve children in need. This program serves approximately 40-60 families each year. Volunteers are needed to organize gifts and facilitate distribution.

Recycling – A receptacle is in the narthex to recycle our service bulletins. We also strive to purchase eco-friendly products for use in our parish activities. Parishioners can also donate their unwanted household items, books, and clothing to Community Aid where we receive funds each quarter for soft goods donations (mention St. Edward's Episcopal Church).

Books for Prisoners – A specific book list is generated of items that are acceptable for our incarcerated brothers and sisters. Books must be inspirational or true stories and have a Christian theme. Money is also accepted.

Soles for Souls – Each year, from Ash Wednesday to Palm Sunday, we collect shoes of any style and in any condition which we pair, box, and count to send to St. John's Lancaster for shipment to areas of the world to help in providing relief, creating jobs and empowering people to break the cycle of poverty.

Feed My Starving Children – This annual MobilPack event partners with organizations in the local community to send healthy, safe meals to malnourished children around the world. This event is typically in March/April of each year.

Race Against Racism – A 5K race cannot end racism but naming the need to create change and working together can make a difference. All proceeds from the Race Against Racism will support the Center for Racial and Gender Equity (CRGE) and their community programs of education, training, advocacy and change. This event typically occurs in April each year and we organize "Team St. Edward's" in the weeks prior to race day.

Blood Drives – Giving the gift of life is so important, especially to folks in our local community, where there is a constant need. The blood drives at St. Edward's work to support our local hospitals. This is typically a May event.

Rahim Family Support – What began as a refugee resettlement ministry, in partnership with Church World Services, has blossomed into a life-giving relationship with this beautiful family. We dine together, participate in family activities together, tutor, attend soccer games, provide legal defense fund support, and extend our love for one another by just being there as they continue to discover their new way of life in our community.

School Supply Drive – Each summer, we collect cash and/or supplies for the Hempfield School District is held in the summer months.

Diocesan Initiatives – Our Diocese of Central Pennsylvania's Prayer, Advocacy, and Action group of clergy and laity meet monthly to forge meaningful ways to work towards addressing gun violence in our communities. In September 2022, St. Edward's hosted a diocesan event - Sowing Seeds of Love: A Morning of Action and Prayer on Ending Gun Violence. The focus of the event was rooted from a faith perspective - responding to God's call to all of us to contribute to the ending of gun violence.

FINANCE

This is a ministry of managing our funds, with faith, to support our mission.

Treasurer

An Officer, appointed by the rector of the parish, ensures that funds of the parish are properly received and disbursed under the direction of the vestry; verifies and pay bills presented for payment; prepares all monthly and annual financial reports for presentation to the vestry, parish, and diocese; presents and recommends to the vestry an annual budget; and submits the financial records of the parish to audit by a qualified person in accordance with Diocesan Canons.

Finance Committee

The Finance Committee shall have such authority as is delegated by the vestry with respect to providing advice to the rector concerning the management of the cash, funds, and investments of the parish.

Offering Counters

Count and record offering from Sunday worship services and other moneygenerating parish events, as well as make bank deposits. Each counter team is a 2-person team.
